PLAN YOUR RETURN JOURNEY TO THE CITY WITH MyPLUS-TTA, AVOID CONGESTION DURING PEAK DAYS

- Avoid Peak Day Congestion expected from 4-7 June 2026

Petaling Jaya, 3 June 2026:- PLUS Malaysia Berhad (PLUS) anticipates a significant increase in traffic volume across its highway network in conjunction with the return commute to the Klang Valley following the conclusion of the Hari Raya Aidiladha and extended festive holidays. Accordingly, PLUS advises the public to plan their return journeys early by referring to the MyPLUS-TTA digital travel schedule to enjoy a smoother travel experience.

Throughout the duration of the return commute to the capital, Peak Days have been identified as 4, 5, 6, and 7 June 2026, during which PLUS expects nearly 2.2 million vehicles per day to utilize its highway network. This surge involves a combination of long-distance traffic movements as well as inter-city travel between major towns heading towards the Klang Valley after the end of the festive and school holiday period.

Therefore, users are advised to adhere to the MyPLUS-TTA schedule, accessible via the PLUS App, and to plan their return journey according to the suggested travel times. This measure is crucial to help balance traffic flow and mitigate congestion at focal points along the highway.

Throughout this festive season, PLUS has also activated Smart Lane routes at 33 strategic locations along the highway. Additionally, all public facilities at Rest and Service Areas (R&Rs) and lay-bys, such as food and beverage stalls, suraus, and toilets, remain open 24 hours. The public is also encouraged to plan their stops for rest or worship at toll plazas located along the highway stretch.

The public may contact PLUSLine at 1800-88-0000 or LPT2Line at 1800-88-0220 should they require emergency assistance. PLUS also advises users to utilize the PLUS App, Waze, or Google Maps to obtain current traffic status during this festive season. Latest traffic updates are also available through the Virtual Assistant (PUTRI), @plustrafik and @lpt2trafik on X, electronic messaging displays (VMS) along the highway, as well as reports from major national radio stations.

As an additional preparation, highway users are reminded to ensure that their Touch 'n Go card and e-Wallet balances (for RFID and JustGO users) are sufficient before beginning their journey to avoid any inconvenience at toll plazas. PLUS calls upon the public to plan their return journeys effectively through MyPLUS-TTA and to always drive prudently for the collective safety of all throughout the journey.

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
