

## **PLUS REMINDS HEAVY VEHICLE OPERATORS AND DRIVERS TO COMPLY WITH HEIGHT LIMITS TO PREVENT HIGHWAY INCIDENTS**

**Petaling Jaya, 29 June 2026** – Following several recent incidents involving low loader vehicles carrying loads exceeding the permissible height limit, PLUS Malaysia Berhad (PLUS) reminds all transport operators and heavy vehicle drivers to strictly comply with the established road safety regulations. Such incidents not only cause significant damage to highway infrastructures but also compromise the safety of other road users and result in severe traffic congestion and delays.

The safety of highway users remains PLUS' utmost priority. In this regard, PLUS views any breach of load and height restrictions seriously and urges all logistics companies and heavy vehicle drivers to ensure that the dimensions of their loads are carefully checked before starting their journey.

To ensure smooth traffic flow and the safety of all highway users, transport operators and drivers are advised to observe the following safety measures:

### **Comply with Height Restrictions**

Ensure that the overall height of the vehicle, including its load, does not exceed 5 metres or any specific height limit prescribed for the respective route and highway structures.

### **Plan Your Route in Advance**

Vehicles transporting oversized or abnormal loads must carefully plan their travel routes and obtain the necessary Special Movement Permit from the relevant authorities prior to the journey.

### **Observe Height Clearance Signage**

Always pay attention to and comply with height restriction signage installed at gantries, overhead bridges, flyovers and toll plaza areas.

### **Use the Designated Toll Lanes**

Heavy vehicles must use the designated toll lanes that are suitable for the size and dimensions of the vehicle and its load.

PLUS adopts a zero-tolerance approach towards any negligence that results in damage to highway assets or endangers the safety of highway users. Appropriate enforcement actions, including legal proceedings where necessary, will be taken against those found responsible.

At the same time, PLUS continues to work closely with the Road Transport Department (JPJ) and the Royal Malaysia Police (PDRM) to strengthen traffic law enforcement across its highway network.

Highway users who witness dangerous and reckless driving behaviours or vehicles carrying suspicious or excessively high loads are encouraged to report the incident immediately via the PLUSLine at 1800-88-0000 or through the PLUS App for further action.
